Offer of Settlement of Pat Kelleher, under P-2149-152

Dear Secretary,

Electricity is the most homogeneous product in the world. Once put on a transmission line you can no longer determine the owner nor the source of generation: solar, wind, hydropower, nuclear or coal.

Today, \$100 of electricity purchased for a residential home from a customer owned Washington State Public Utility District would provide 995 kilowatt-hours in Kittitas County, 2,056 kilowatt-hours in Grant County, 3,077 kilowatt-hours in Chelan County and 4,117 kilowatt-hours in Douglas County.

In the 1960's \$100 would have bought roughly the same kilowatt-hours of electricity in each county.

Additional testimony concerning this matter was given to FERC, 12May2011 (eLibrary 20010512-4011 pg32-pg36)

The settlement offer will not correct the history of grossly unfair retail price disparities among contiguous utilities directly caused by previous FERC licensing orders. The settlement will put a stop to the future worsening of retail price disparities and is revenue neutral on a wholesale basis to Douglas Public Utility District. The settlement offer is in the Public Interest.

Settlement Offer of Pat Kelleher :

That Douglas Public Utility District enter a wholesale power sales contract to provide Tier 2 power requirements as required above Kittitas Public Utility District 2010 Tier 1 high water mark, at project cost for the term of the license.
